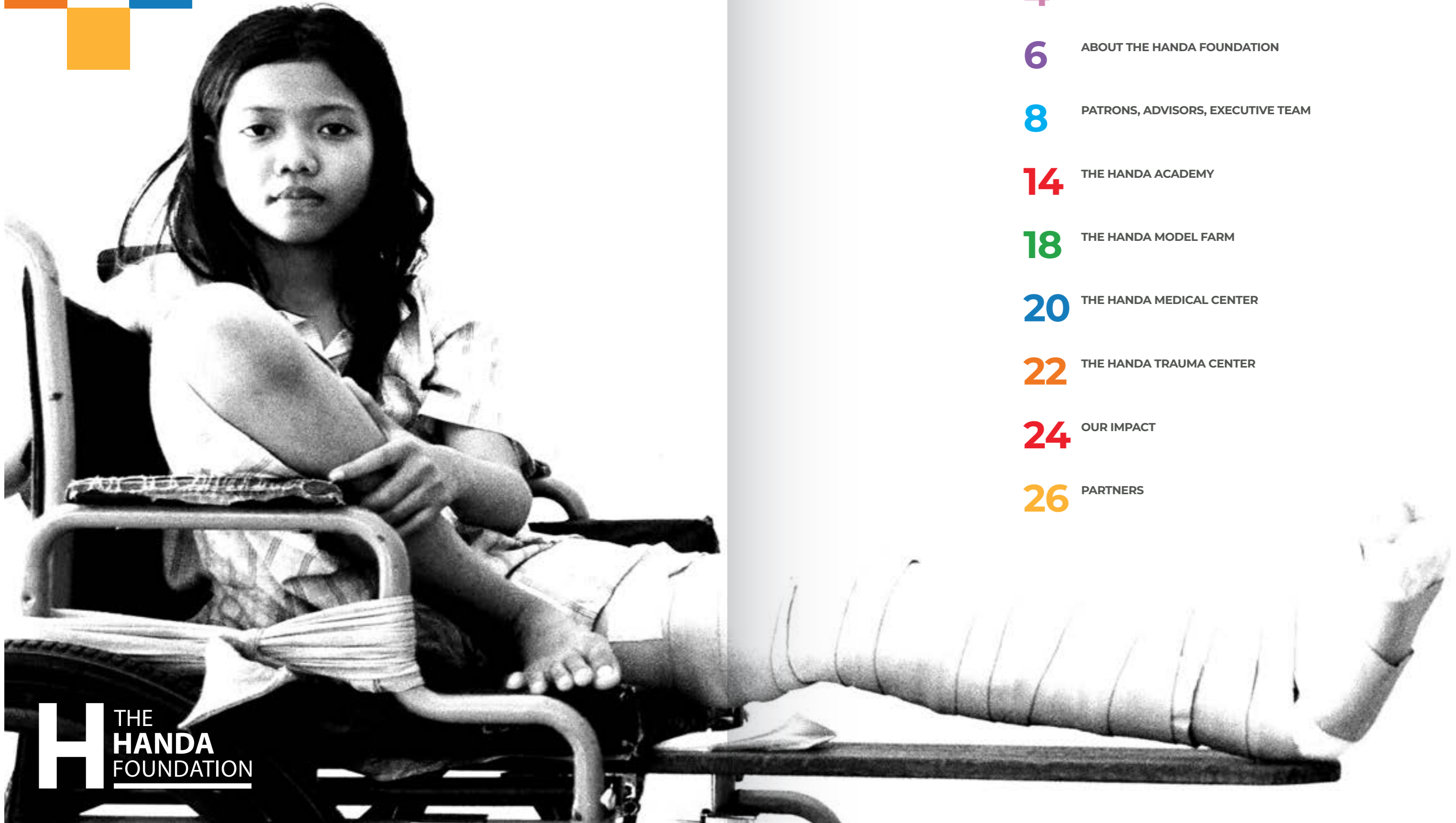
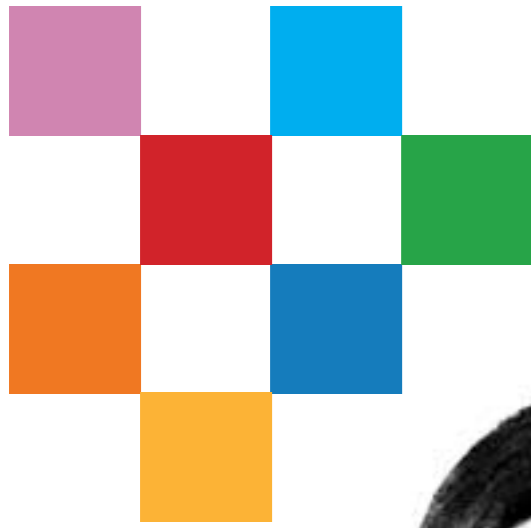

BIOGRAPHY

Dr. Haruhisa Handa (a.k.a. Toshu Fukami) was born in 1951. He attended Doshisha University in Kyoto where he received a degree in economics. He then went on to study with the Master Class at Musashino Academia Musicae where he graduated with a major in vocal music. He also earned a master's degree in creative arts from the Western Australian Academy of Performing Arts at Edith Cowan University, West Australia, as well as a Ph.D. in Literature from the Academy of Arts & Design at Tsinghua University, China.

Apart from his scholarly pursuits, Dr. Handa has also been recognized in various countries for his long-standing commitment to public service. In Cambodia, he was conferred the title of Commander of the Royal Order of Sahametrei. In Japan, he received the Medal with Dark Blue Ribbon and serves as the Honorary Consul of the Kingdom of Cambodia in Fukuoka. He also won the Honorary Award of Contribution towards the Chinese Choral Enterprise.

In Australia, he received a distinguished service medal from the State of Western Australia, keys to the Cities of Perth and Swan, and an Honorary Citizenship in Melbourne.

Dr. Handa has founded and supports numerous not-for-profit organizations throughout the world, and is actively involved in the development of many types of humanitarian and cultural programs. He serves as the Managing Director of B.C. Consulting Ltd and manages more than a dozen companies in Japan, Australia, and the United Kingdom. He is also an active author and has written more than 220 books that have been translated into seven languages.

LETTER FROM DR HARUHISA HANDA, FOUNDER AND HONORARY CHAIRMAN OF THE HANDA FOUNDATION

From a very early age, I knew that helping the less fortunate would be a significant part of my life's work. Over the past three decades, it has been both rewarding and inspirational to see the people of Cambodia rebuild their country after the devastation they experienced during a decade of war, disease and famine. Today, Cambodia is almost unrecognizable from the Cambodia I first visited almost 30 years ago.

When I founded The Handa Foundation in 2012, it was a natural progression from the work I had been and continue to be a part of in Phnom Penh - such as serving as the Chancellor of the University of Cambodia, serving as the Founder and Founding Board Member of the Sihanouk Hospital, and supporting various projects of the Cambodian Red Cross. The Handa Foundation has intentionally expanded into the more rural and impoverished areas of Cambodia, serving a population of people who continue to feel the lingering effects of war and poverty.

My heartfelt thanks go out to the people, both in and outside of Japan, who have supported the work of The Handa Foundation. The support we have received from the Cambodian Ministry of Health, the Cambodian Ministry of Foreign Affairs, the current and former Provincial Governors of Battambang, as well as the Battambang Provincial Health Department - has been strong, consistent and deeply appreciated. I am also thankful for the staff and volunteers of The Handa Foundation throughout Southeast Asia who strive every day to deliver compassionate health care and lifechanging education to the people in the region who need it most.

ABOUT THE HANDA FOUNDATION

For the past 30 years Dr. Haruhisa Handa, through the various organizations he leads, has been generously supporting the development of Cambodia and its recovery from decades of war. This support has included the formation and development of a national university, a free adult hospital in the capital, a national TV station, various programs of the Cambodian Red Cross, and several other important initiatives.

In 2012 Dr. Haruhisa Handa founded a new International NGO called The Handa Foundation, which has been registered in the United States, the United Kingdom and the Kingdom of Cambodia. It is a non-religious, non-political, not-for-profit organization with the mission of building increasingly sustainable local projects to help vulnerable people live significantly better lives. It receives funding from various individuals and organizations and is driven by Dr. Handa's visionary leadership.

The Handa Foundation supports the Handa Medical Center, the Handa Trauma Center, the Handa Academy, and the Handa Model Farm in Cambodia, the Handa Nursing School in Laos, the Handa Global Scholars Program at the London School of Hygiene and Tropical Medicine, as well as other events, partnerships and initiatives.

PROGRAMS OF THE HANDA FOUNDATION ARE INTENDED TO REFLECT THE FOLLOWING CRITERIA:

- Function in close cooperation with the authorities of the local government.
- Provide an immediate and transformational impact on their communities.
- Become increasingly self-sustaining over time.
- Offer career enhancing training opportunities for local professionals.
- Serve a disadvantaged population within the country.



WHY CAMBODIA?

The Khmer Rouge ruled Cambodia for only four years (1975 – 1979), but in that short span of time they were responsible for a genocide that claimed the lives of close to two million people. The ruthless regime led by Pol Pot took hold of Cambodia's population with the purpose of forcing millions of people into an agrarian republic. Their efforts resulted in gross atrocities including execution, starvation, overwork and the spreading of diseases.

After Vietnam stepped in and overthrew the regime, the brave people of Cambodia began to rebuild their lives. Unfortunately, however, the effects of the war were far from over. The displacement of millions of people meant that most had to start their lives from the ground up in a crippled economy and a land littered with active landmines.

Millions of unexploded landmines remain scattered across the country, and despite the steady economic growth of the country, thousands still suffer from inadequate employment, housing, education and health care. Many of the programs of The Handa Foundation operate in Cambodia, reflecting the deep love Dr. Haruhisa Handa has for its people.

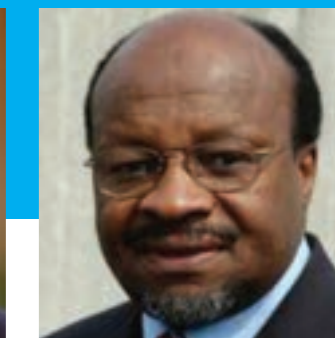

ABOUT THE **HANDA** ACADEMY

The Handa Academy (THA) is one of the newest programs of The Handa Foundation, having opened its doors in 2017. However, it is already making waves throughout the community in Battambang, Cambodia and beyond. This local project seeks to improve children's lives by feeding their bodies, minds, and souls.

In 2018, THA was recognized as a new global initiative partner to the Family Care First Program, which is facilitated by Save the Children and funded by USAID, Unicef and others. The Family Care First Program is a network of hand-picked organizations working collaboratively with governments, local and international NGOs, academic institutions and UN agencies to promote and strengthen family-based care for children.

The campus of THA is designed to provide four hours of instruction, as well as a nutritious lunch, to 300 students per day, five days a week. The students, aged 6 to 18, live in walking distance from the academy in a community identified as one of the most disadvantaged in the entire country. THA exemplifies the priorities of the Family Care First Program by strengthening entire families, helping parents understand the importance of keeping their children in school through high school, and preparing the children to be ready for either college or a lucrative local vocation after high school.



THE HANDA FOUNDATION IS PROUD TO BE A PART OF THE CHANGE TAKING PLACE IN CAMBODIA. ITS AIM IS TO GIVE THE CHILDREN IN THE BATTAMBANG COMMUNITY THE TOOLS NECESSARY FOR WHOLISTIC GROWTH. THEREFORE, THE PROGRAMS OFFER ACTIVITIES THAT TARGET THREE MAIN AREAS:

Bodies

- Nutritious and filling lunches are served each day to promote high levels of growth and energy.
- Health and Hygiene skills are taught to improve quality of life and extend life expectancy.

Minds

- English and Computer Classes teach skills not covered in the public schools.
- Vocational Training is provided to cultivate interest in potential careers.

Souls

- Mentoring relationships with instructors, volunteers, and the staff provide positive examples of success and kindness.
- Sports, Art, and Music are taught to encourage leadership, teamwork, exercise and creativity.



OUR IMPACT

THERE ARE A VARIETY OF OBSTACLES THAT PREVENT CHILDREN IN THE BATTAMBANG COMMUNITY FROM REACHING THEIR POTENTIAL.

- **MALNUTRITION:** More than 55% of the children in Battambang are stunted in their physical growth because of poor nutrition (Cambodian Health Survey).

THA INTERVENTION: The children at THA receive a large lunch each day and many of them have seen their body weight increase by 10% or more over a period of just three months, dramatically changing their personal appearance and energy levels.

- **A HIGH DROPOUT RATE IN THE LOCAL SCHOOLS:** Only 50% of the children in Battambang Province continue going to school after their fourth year of elementary school (Cambodian Ministry of Education).

THA INTERVENTION: One of the primary objectives of THA is to help every student complete high school and pursue higher education in college or a vocational school. THA promotes strong mentoring relationships that provide students with support and tutoring that may otherwise not be available.

- **PROLIFIC MIGRANT LABOR:** Many of the children at The Handa Academy have only one parent because 35-50% of the men in Northwest Cambodia work and live in Thailand most of the year (World Bank). Studies have shown that children without fathers are half as likely to find stable employment, four times as likely to go to jail, and seven times as likely to become pregnant as teenagers (Unicef).

THA INTERVENTION: The male staff members of THA are carefully selected to demonstrate the behavior and characteristics that allow them to be the healthy male role models that many of the children need.



SUSTAINABLE DEVELOPMENT GOALS

ALL OF THE THA ACTIVITIES HAVE BEEN CAREFULLY CONSIDERED AND PURPOSELY ALIGNED WITH MANY OF THE UNITED NATIONS' "17 SUSTAINABLE DEVELOPMENT GOALS FOR 2030" IN ORDER TO MAXIMIZE THE BENEFIT TO EACH OF THE CHILDREN IN THE PROGRAM.

GOAL 1 : NO POVERTY

THA is helping to break the cycle of poverty in the poorest province of Cambodia by equipping the next generation with the education and tools they will need to complete high school and then pursue college or vocational school.

GOAL 2 : ZERO HUNGER

THA provides hundreds of meals per week to impoverished children and also partners with the Handa Model Farm to teach the THA families effective agricultural methods to grow their own vegetable farms.

GOAL 3 : GOOD HEALTH

THA teaches good health and hygiene to the children and works with volunteers from the Handa Medical Center to provide basic health education to their families.

GOAL 4 : QUALITY EDUCATION

THA focuses on giving elementary-aged children a head start by teaching them the basic language and computer skills they will need to complete high school and qualify for college or vocational training.

GOAL 5 : GENDER EQUALITY

More than half of the Cambodian population is female, but only 26% of its' government jobs are filled by women. Across all job sectors in the country, women earn less than half the salary of their male counterparts (The Asia Foundation). THA takes on this challenge by equipping young girls and young women with quality education and practical leadership skills designed to help them compete in an unbalanced job market.

GOAL 6 : DECENT WORK

THA aims to provide both children and their parents with the opportunity to learn vocational skills that will lead to good jobs. THA provides practical instruction of transferable agricultural skills through The Handa Model Farm in partnership with USAID and the World Vegetable Association. THA also aims to provide dedicated programs to prepare students for careers in the fields of garment manufacturing and tourism.



ABOUT THE HANDA MODEL FARM

The Handa Model Farm is located just ten minutes from the Handa Medical Center in Battambang and has approximately twelve hectares of rich organic farmland for cultivating fruit trees, vegetables and organically raised fish. It has the two-fold strategy of being a center that hosts training events in farming techniques for the local community, while also donating high quality produce for the patients and guests to enjoy free of charge at various programs of The Handa Foundation.



OUR SERVICES

The Handa Foundation continuously seeks ways to provide life-changing services to the community. Since its inception in 2014, the Handa Model Farm has successfully partnered with the World Vegetable Center (WVC) and the United States Agency for International Development (USAID). Together with these organizations, the model farm provides an educational platform for more experienced farmers to train locals interested in learning agricultural techniques which can be used on their family farms. Children enrolled at The Handa Academy, together with their families, also develop life skills in various areas of farming while actively cultivating crops that are donated to benefit others.



OUR IMPACT

Over the past six years, dozens of farmers have been able to improve their productivity thanks to the techniques they have learned. Our program has also helped more than 50 families learn how to cultivate their own fruits and vegetables at home, allowing them to sustainably provide food and/or a source of income for their families. Additionally, thousands of dollars' worth of fruits, vegetables, and fish have been donated to help feed those in need.

ABOUT THE HANDA MEDICAL CENTER

OUR IMPACT

By providing a high-quality general medical facility for the general population, local medical professionals can learn advanced medical techniques while at the same time helping the underprivileged.

More than 110,000 patients have been treated by the HMC since its inception, and more than 2,500 patients come from all over Northwest Cambodia for care each month.

The HMC is also doing its part for the earth. The facility is 100% green, powered by an array of solar panels that cover the rooftops of all the buildings.



The Handa Medical Center (HMC) was opened adjacent to the The Handa Trauma Center in 2013. The HMC has been warmly welcomed by the community and the patient volumes have grown every year as new staff, services and facilities have been added. The campus now includes a new reception area, 10 consultation rooms, a pharmacy, a laboratory and a new medical in-patient ward with 24 beds including six isolation rooms.

OUR SERVICES

The Handa Medical Center is proud to provide a wide range of comprehensive urgent, primary, internal, surgical, orthopedic and hospital services. The list of services provided continues to expand as the people of Northwest Cambodia would rather stay in Cambodia than travel to other countries for high-quality medical care.

OUR MISSION

THE HMC HAS A THREE-FOLD MISSION:

- Provide high-quality general medical services to the general public.
- Provide on the job training for young Cambodian doctors, nurses and other medical professionals.
- Produce surplus revenues that are donated to support the free care provided to the poor through other programs of The Handa Foundation.



ABOUT THE HANDA TRAUMA CENTER

In 1998, an Italian charity named Emergency opened a hospital in Battambang to provide free medical care to victims of landmines and unexploded ordnances. In 2011, Emergency faced financial difficulties that forced it to begin the process of shutting down the hospital. This was a tragic development as it would leave many in the region without access to proper trauma care. Fortunately, just a month before their planned closure, The Handa Foundation was able to step in and take over both the management and the funding of the facility, renamed the World Mate Emergency Hospital. Thus, together with the support of the Cambodian government, the free trauma care provided to the less fortunate has continued to this day. Later in 2018, at the request of the Ministry of Health, the World Mate Emergency Hospital became the Handa Trauma Center.

In addition to providing trauma care to thousands of people per month, the Handa Trauma Center has now expanded the scope of its care and welcomed in new partners. Although the initial focus of the hospital was to provide care to war victims, the majority of the patients seen today are the victims of traffic accidents.

The services provided by the Handa Trauma Center in Battambang remain critical to the region. As the economy has grown, more and more people have been able to afford their own motorcycles. Despite efforts by the government to implement traffic laws, the quantity of roadway accidents continues to climb and actually claim more lives each year in Cambodia than HIV, Malaria, and TB combined. Many of these accidents result in complex trauma cases that few hospitals in the region are equipped to properly manage. Thus, the quantity of patients served at the Handa Trauma Center has steadily increased over the past 20 years. In total, more than half of the landmine survivors from the entire country have been cared for during this time, completely free of charge. In addition, the quantity of patients seen at the facility, as well as those cared for by the mobile clinic, grows every year. To date, more than 220,000 patients have been cared for by the Handa Trauma Center over the past two decades. In January of 2019, the local community gathered to celebrate this life-giving milestone for the hospital's 20th anniversary.

The existing medical education system in Cambodia provides a minimal level of hands-on training for health care professionals. Many new doctors and nurses have learned the theory of providing medical care but lack a strong residency or training experience in the actual provision of care to patients. This is particularly true when it comes to the doctors and nurses trying to provide complex trauma care.

The Handa Trauma Center has incorporated both classroom learning and on-the-job training into the weekly schedule of its health care staff. In addition to the local and expatriate leaders who provide this learning and training, the organization is blessed to have a steady stream of volunteer medical professionals who stay for a few weeks or months at a time. Ongoing partnership with prominent universities like Stanford University, Curtin University and The London School of Hygiene and Tropical Medicine also provide the staff with unique opportunities to work with leaders in their fields and to participate in research studies that have a global impact.

In the past 20 years, hundreds of doctors and nurses have been trained at the Handa Trauma Center. Because the Center has an excellent reputation in the region, the staff who have been trained often leave to open their own clinics or to take leadership roles in local hospitals.



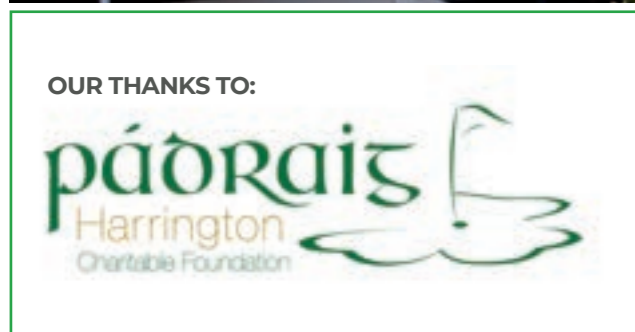
OUR IMPACT

Doing Our Part To Be Green!

In 2017, a professional golfer named Padraig Harrington agreed to donate the components required to assemble a renewable energy system to power the buildings of the Handa Medical Center. The panels were installed on top of three different buildings. In addition to helping the environment, they also create a good deal of savings.

The annual savings now being realized by the Padraig Harrington Renewable Energy System allow The Handa Foundation to provide free medical care to about 500 additional patients per year. The system is expected to operate efficiently for 15 years, so the overall impact during this period will be the provision of additional free health care for about 7,500 people.

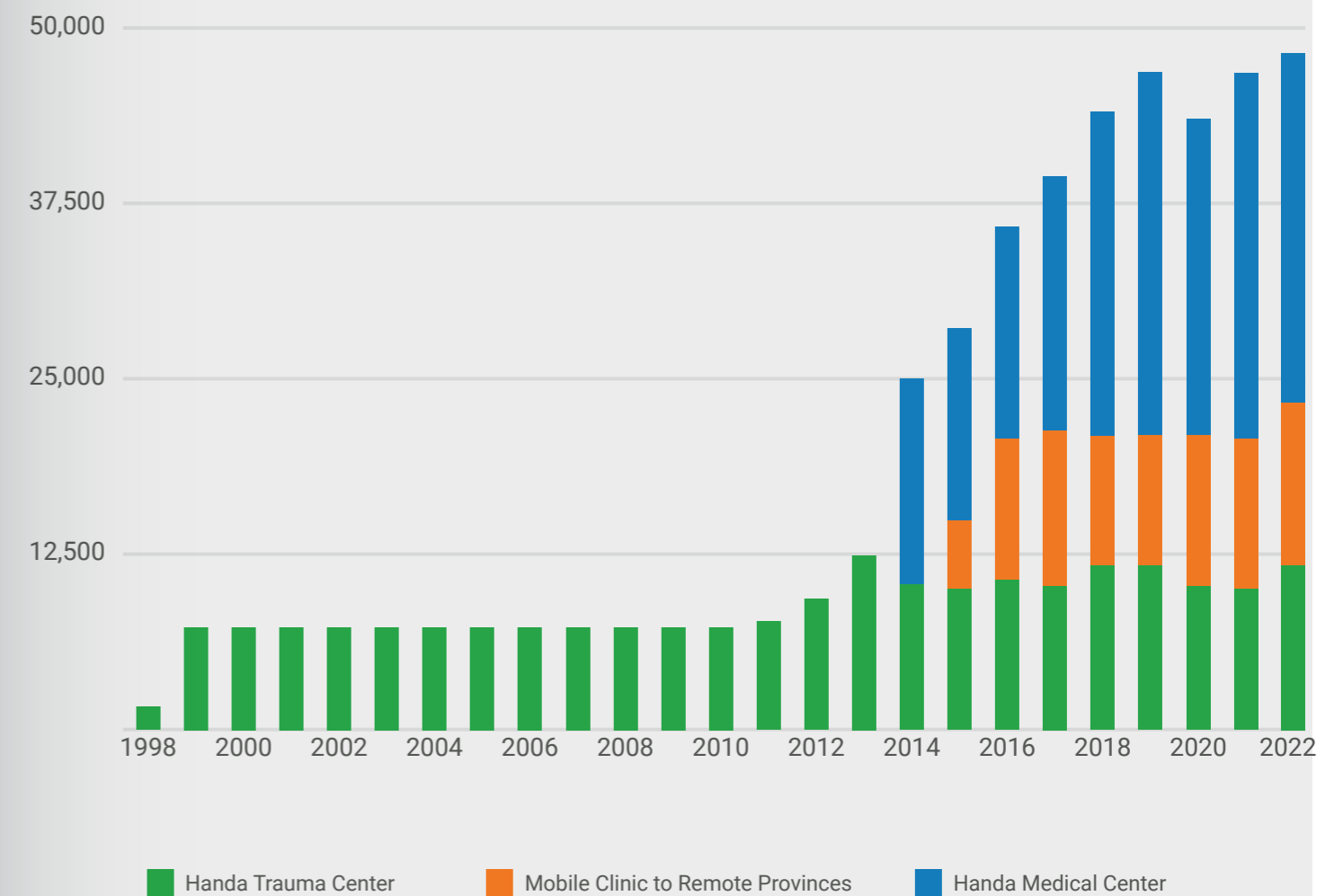

THE HANDA FOUNDATION'S UNDERLYING GOAL IS TO IMPROVE THE QUALITY OF LIFE FOR THE PEOPLE OF CAMBODIA AND TO SUPPORT THEIR RECOVERY FROM DECADES OF WAR.

This is also the driving force behind the Handa Medical Center and the Handa Trauma Center. The impact of these programs can be measured by both the total quantity of patients cared for (as shown in the graph below), as well as the hundreds of healthcare professionals who have been trained at these facilities over the past 20 years.

Patients Served Each Year - 1998 to 2022



- The **Handa Medical Center** provides a variety of affordable medical services to the general population.
- The **Mobile Clinic** at the Handa Trauma Center provides free primary medical care to people living in remote provinces.
- The **Handa Trauma Center** provides free trauma care to patients who cannot afford to pay. 77% of the patients are treated for closed fractures, burns, cuts and abrasions and 23% of the patients have major orthopedic surgeries of all types.
